<p>Objective(s) / Learning Target(s):</p>	<p>1. To create an account in “Future Ready Iowa” and start to explore careers based on a 60 question interest inventory.</p>
<p>Materials Needed:</p>	<p>Materials</p> <p>1. LCD Projector & student laptops</p>
<p>Suggested Process:</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Have students share any good news they might have since the last time they met (can be school-related, personal, extra-curricular related, etc.). You can model this by sharing any good news of your own. 2. Tell students that today they are going to create an account in Future Ready Iowa and look at some careers that they may be suited for after high school or college. <p>Instructions:</p> <p>Go to https://tinyurl.com/smp453h3</p> <p>Go to “Sign Up” in the upper right hand corner then to “Create Profile”</p> <p>Enter your first and last name, use your school gmail account, then your school gmail password, and enter your school name (GHS)</p> <p>Click that you’ve read the Privacy Policy and click “Create Profile”</p> <p>On the next page, you’ll see “Profile” in the upper left hand corner and on the right side of your name, you’ll see a window that says “Take the career assessment.” Click on that.</p> <p>Choose the “Detailed Assessment” on the right-hand side and click “60 questions”</p> <p>Once you are done, read through your top three traits (left hand side and “Show More” under each) – are these accurate for you?</p> <p>Underneath your “Top 3 Traits” are your top career matches (the one at the top is the top “Career Cluster” from your career assessment)</p> <p>Take some time to look at the job matches that are a 75% match or higher under each “Career Cluster”.</p> <p>Click on the subcategories under each “Career Cluster” and the jobs listed under each. Remember, just look at those that have the highest % match for you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Which of these interest you? • Does the education required to do the job appeal to you? • Does the average (median) salary appeal to you?

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When you click on the job, what does it say for annual job openings? • What are the education choices (schools that have the program) listed? <p>Keep this site handy – as you start to think about what you might do in the future, log into it to give yourself some ideas of where you need to be looking to get into that field.</p>
