

## Fashion Design Syllabus

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Fashion Design is a course providing the student with guidelines for selection, care, design and construction of textiles.

### LEARNING TARGETS:

The student will:

- examine fabrics to determine effects of texture, pattern, and color on visual appearances.
  - evaluate textile purchases for quality.
- incorporate the principles and elements of design in clothing
- demonstrate construction techniques.
  - understand the care textiles need.
