Recommended Sequence	
Objective(s) / Learning Target(s):	1. Seminar leaders and students will have the opportunity to reconnect after winter break with some simple conversation starters.

Suggested Process:	1. Welcome students back from winter break and ask for any good news they might have to share (something good that's happened to them since the last time you've been together). You could also update them on their Random Acts project results – did your group get a thank you note or can you share how your project impacted the recipients? 2. Today's activity is simply to reconnect and to get everyone talking again after our break. Jump in and respond to any of these questions – practice respectfully listening to others, sharing your thoughts and responses as well. Feel free to share your responses to these as well, especially if your kids ask you to. 0) If you could live anywhere in the world, where would it be? 1) What was the last thing you purchased? 2) Are you a spender or a saver? 3) What type of little kid were you? (e.g. spoiled, rebellious, quiet, obnoxious, well-behaved . . .) 4) What is one thing you miss about being a little kid? 5) What did you want to be when you were growing up? 6) What's the best piece of advice that you ever received? 7) What are you most scared of? 8) If you could have any superpower, what would it be? 9) Can money buy you happiness? 10) What's your favorite movie of all time? 11) What's your biggest regret? 12) Is it possible to start off poor in America, work hard, and become well-off? 13) Would you ever want to be home-schooled? 14) Should college education be free for everyone? 15) Does technology in the classroom ever get in the way of learning? 16) In what ways are you a nerd or a geek? 17) Do you believe that people are inherently good? 18) What 3 things would you grab if your house was on fire? 19) What would you do if you only had a week left to live?
