<b>Recommended Sequence</b>	<b>Seminar Meeting</b>
<b>Objective(s) / Learning Target(s):</b>	Activities will help students: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Develop reasons for why students fail classes and what they can do to pass their courses</li> <li>• Reflect upon their own grades and predict what their teachers may say about their performance during Parent/Teacher Conferences</li> </ul>
<b>Materials Needed:</b>	<b>Materials</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• LCD Projector/Laptop</li> </ul>
<b>Suggested Process:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Explain to students why we do 3 week, Midterm, and 9 week grade checks (Reason: to track student progress and to figure out what we can be doing to help students be successful in their classes).</li>   <li>3. After you have done this, explain to students (if they don't know how – and some don't), how to check their grades on Infinite Campus:             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Go to: <a href="https://grinnell-k12.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/grinnell.jsp?status=portalLogoff&amp;lang=en">https://grinnell-k12.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/grinnell.jsp?status=portalLogoff&amp;lang=en</a></li> <li>b. Log in with username: (5 digit lunch number)</li> <li>c. Password is first initial, last initial and date of birth (Ted Smith, born on March 7<sup>th</sup>, 1999 would be ts030799)</li> <li>d. If they know how to get into their Infinite Campus Portals, then don't worry about this step – this is only for those kids that have been living under a rock for the first 6 weeks of school).</li> </ol> </li>   <li>2. After you've explained this, conference with each of your Seminar students about their grades: <b>Spend your time and use the questions below with students who are struggling (D's &amp; F's). If kids are doing fine, just do a quick "touch base" about their grades.</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>#1. <i>Are you giving your best effort in your classes – why or why not?</i></li> <li>#2. <i>Are you going to E2 – if so, how often?</i></li> <li>#3. <i>What are you going to start doing that you're not doing now to be successful?</i></li> <li>#4. <i>What are your parents' reactions to your grades – what do you think they will hear from your teachers if they come to conferences? Is this accurate?</i></li> <li>#5. <i>What can you do to prove to your teacher that you are taking the course seriously?</i></li> <li>#6. <i>Who's responsibility is it for you to be successful?</i></li> <li>#7. <i>If your teacher could do one thing to help you, what would it be?</i></li> </ol> </li> </ol>
