Recommended Sequence	Seminar Meeting
Objective(s) / Learning Target(s):	Activities will help students: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • understand that food insecurity impacts people locally • as HS students, they can make a difference by donating food locally
Materials Needed:	LCD Projector
Suggested Process:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Before you start the activity, ask your students to share any pieces of good news they have (something good that’s happened to them since your last meeting – from school, personal lives, extracurriculars, etc.). Not everyone has to share, but give kids a chance to do this. You can model this by sharing a piece of good news that you have. 2. Ask students if they know what MICA is or stands for? It is the Mid Iowa Community Action organization that serves needy families. One of the most visible services MICA provides is the local food pantry. Every fall, MICA struggles to keep its food pantry shelves stocked to meet the needs of local families. In the fall of 2019, we collected almost 2,000 pounds of food and more than \$2,500 & we’re going to try to beat that this year. 3. How important is MICA to some families? * When families don’t have enough food – “food insecure” – they have to make choices like these: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 69% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or paying for their utilities (gas, electricity, water, etc.) - 67% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or putting gas in their vehicles - 66% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or getting medical care - 58% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or paying for housing 4. Here’s an example of a why food pantries are important . . . https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WyVri9edOrU After watching the video, use these discussion prompts with your group: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What does food insecurity mean to you? • How can you help someone that is suffering from food insecurity? • Why do you think people suffer from food insecurity? • Is it their own fault or are they “victims”? <p>SO, what can we do? Bring non-perishable food items or cash during our October Seminar meetings!</p>

Ask seminar members to drop off donations to Mr. Hunter's room. (*Ask for any Thespian or Curtain Club member to volunteer*)

Seminar members should return after taking the donations

Your bag & envelope should be returned by the end of the seminar period
